



Information to help prepare you for camp

We look forward to welcoming you to Konomie Island Environmental Education Centre (KIEEC) and hope the following information is helpful in planning your trip.

Venue:

Konomie Island Environmental Education Centre is a Department of Education Queensland facility located on a leasehold within the National Park that is Konomie Island (North Keppel Island). There are no shops or other facilities on the island, so please bring whatever personal items (medications, toiletries, etc) you may need. There is no smoking on the lease itself.

Transport to Konomie Island:

We travel aboard our boat, *Gundoo Spirit*, which is a large yellow catamaran, moored at Keppel Bay Marina, Red Pier 3. Search “The Waterline Restaurant” for easy Google Map directions.

Please note that we do **not** leave from Pier One, Rosslyn Bay Harbour which is the departure terminal for Freedom Fast Cats.

Car Parking:

The public car park at Keppel Bay Marina is free but is an unsecured area. Safe undercover parking and transport to the Marina is available at a cost from Cap Coast Storage (P: 0488 004 785). This needs to be pre-booked.

Catering:

All meals, including morning and afternoon tea, are provided in the cost of the registration fee. Please complete the medical form to ensure we can cater for any special dietary requirements needed. To avoid pests being attracted to accommodation, no additional food is to be brought on camp.

Accommodation:

Student accommodation cabins have two separate bedrooms, and comfortably accommodate 11 people. Each cabin has its own shower, wash basin and composting toilet.



Safety:

Konomie Island EEC manages participant safety during all learning activities through comprehensive and systematic risk mitigation procedures as required by the Department of Education Queensland. All staff are experienced, trained and qualified in the land and water-based activities offered at KIEEC. Additional documentation regarding safety procedures at KIEEC are available on our website.



Luggage:

As we all help unload our luggage from the boat on and off a trailer on the beach, it is best to keep personal luggage manageable. An overnight bag & a backpack are preferable to one heavy bag / suitcase. KIEEC has a baggage weight limit of **20kg per bag**.

During your stay, you will be participating in a variety of water and land-based activities and the following clothing and equipment is required to ensure your safety as we explore the natural world of Konomie Island. It is recommended that all items are **clearly labelled**.

Medication:

All student medication should be handed in to their teacher and be accompanied by the relevant medication administration documentation. Please ensure you complete the medical form comprehensively and discuss your student's health requirements well in advance of attending camp.

What to wear on your arrival day:

You will need to walk directly onto the beach from the boat as you arrive, so please wear shorts or long pants you can roll up, and shoes that you can easily take off or get wet.
