Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Regularly meeting online with a Woppaburra Chosen Descendent with a pre-determined cost per hr to examine the units being taught at KIEEC and how Woppaburra perspectives may fit
- Regularly meeting online with a Woppaburra Elder to ensure cultural protocol is being followed at a pre – determined cost per hr
- Having both the Woppaburra Descendent and Elder back on Country to complete final review and present the units of work with localized Woppaburra perspectives
